

Academic Position in the Area of Inflammatory Pain

The **Calvin, Phoebe & Joan Snyder Institute of Infection, Immunity and Inflammation of the University of Calgary Faculty of Medicine**, in partnership with the Department of Physiology and Pharmacology, invites applications from outstanding scientists for a full-time academic position, at the Assistant Professor level, in the Inflammation Research Network (IRN). Current members of the IRN conduct research on inflammatory diseases of the gastrointestinal, respiratory and musculoskeletal systems. The University of Calgary provides state-of-the-art core facilities in cellular and molecular biology, imaging, FACS analysis and behavioural pharmacology. In addition, the Department of Physiology and Pharmacology is currently engaged in developing a translational pain research program in partnership with other departments and institutes. Applications from individuals with interests in all areas of inflammation and pain are encouraged, but priority areas include visceral hypersensitivity and arthritis-associated pain. Calgary is a vibrant, multicultural city (pop. >1,000,000) located close to Banff National Park and the Rocky Mountains.

Qualifications include a PhD and/or MD, or equivalent, postdoctoral experience and an excellent publication record. While salary support and start-up funds are provided, the selected candidate will be encouraged to apply for salary support and establishment funding from the Alberta Heritage Foundation for Medical Research and/or the Canadian Institutes of Health Research.
